The GiHF IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship is a 3-day program designed to improve the knowledge and practical skills of advanced practice providers and nurses in community gastroenterology practices who care for patients with IBD. Advanced practice providers and nurses will have the opportunity to learn from GiHF Centers of Educational Excellence faculty and NP/PAs in and out of clinic during this interactive preceptorship.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Does it cost anything to participate in the IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship?

No. This program is free to participate by educational grants from Janssen Biotech, Inc., Pfizer Inc. and Takeda Pharmaceuticals U.S.A., Inc.

2. What is the application process?

To apply for the IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship, please select “apply now” next to the center you wish to participate. Once we receive your application, the center you selected will review and notify you of your acceptance within two weeks of receiving your application.

3. Please describe the first day of the preceptorship:

The IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship will begin with a full day didactic meeting taking place on a Saturday. Presentations will be divided amongst three expert faculty from the center you selected. Food and beverages will be provided throughout the day.

4. Please describe the second and third day of the preceptorship:

Our second and third day of the IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship will be the in-clinic portion of the program. These two days may not immediately follow the Saturday meeting. During the two days, your time will be divided amongst the care team at your selected center. The care team will share best practices to help optimize your time in-clinic, through a customized experience designed to best meet your educational needs.

5. Are all 3 days of the IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship consecutive?

No. Following the full day meeting, our experts will work with you to arrange when your in-clinic will take place. The in-clinic dates will vary depending on the center and your educational goals.

6. How many hours is the in-clinic?

Clinic hours on day two and three will vary depending on the center. We advise participants to anticipate at least 4 hours in-clinic on each day.

7. When will I receive credit for participating in the IBD APP & Nurse Preceptorship?

Following the first day of the preceptorship, participants will be emailed an evaluation and certificate activity. Please take this activity in its entirety. Following your submission, you will receive a PDF certificate awarding your credits. This will also apply for the second and third day of the preceptorship.
